The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on Wednesday, June 23, acknowledged that there is an association with heart inflammation, primarily in young people, after receiving the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) Virus (COVID-19) mRNA

vaccines, and that the vaccines should carry a warning statement, Children's Health Defence reported.

Through a slide presentation, the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunisation Practices (ACIP) reported more than 1,200 cases of a rare heart inflammation disease in 16–24-year-olds who received the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine with questionable mRNA technology. As of June 11, the agency added that 267 cases of myocarditis or pericarditis were reported in people who had one shot of the mRNA vaccine and 827 cases after the second shot. In addition, there are 132 additional cases where the number of doses received is unknown.

Myocarditis is an inflammation of the heart muscle that can lead to cardiac arrhythmias and death. Pericarditis, meanwhile, refers to inflammation of the pericardium, which is the thin membrane surrounding the heart.

LAST WEEK, the CDC confirmed that the COVID vaccine has resulted in more young people being hospitalized than from the COVID virus itself.

Stephanie de Garay, a mother, sobbed as she narrated the story of her daughter, Maddie de Garay, who was an active, healthy young woman until she received the COVID vaccine in December.
